2. What Does God's Voice Sound Like?


- A. In a sermon, Billy Graham explained God communicating to us like us trying to communicate with ants.³

 - 2. The voice saying, "I love you," probably sounds like a thundering roar while they go about their busy little lives.
 - 3. Billy Graham went on to say that God became an ant so He could tell us how much He loves us.
 - 4. The difference is far greater than this illustration. The truth is that nothing can be compared to who He is or that kind of Love.
- B. What God's voice sounds like will be discussed for eternity as we continue discover who He is, what He says, and what it means.

3. It is a problem when someone does not to know God's voice.

"But now, O Jacob, listen to the Lord who created you. O Israel, the one who formed you says, 'Do not be afraid, for I have ransomed you. I have called you by name; you are mine."

- 4. You do not acknowledge the voice of the stranger you flee from the stranger. You know the voice of your loved one.
- It does not matter whether or not the sheep around me are interested in hearing God's voice.
- A. When I am God's, I hear and recognize His voice. It is distinguished above all other voices.
 - When a mother calls her child by name, even in a multitude of people that child will know his/her mother's voice.
 - 2. A child will know both the sound and tone of a mother's voice.
 - When two people have been close and have been together often, a voice can mean intimacy.
 - a. But if a baby is given up as an infant, that child would not know his/her biological mother's voice.
 - 4. A mother's voice can mean comfort when a child is hurting.
 - 5. A child knows he/she is in trouble when a mother's tone of voice changes and that child is called by first and middle name.
 - 6. When a child trusts his/her mother's voice, that voice can provide rescue: "Come to me now!"
